Part B. CV SUMMARY (max. 5000 characters, including spaces)

During my academic career, I have been working in various lines of research: The first of them is focused on the study of the religiosity of Greek navigators. This research is linked to the topic of my doctoral thesis and the funded research projects in which I was involved. My thesis was published in the British Archaeological Reports at Oxford and is commonly cited by other scholars. Due to my predoctoral scholarships, I was made international research stays in great standing centers (United Kingdom, France, Italy).

My second line of research is related to **Historiography**, in which I was introduced by the European Project *Bibliotheca Academica Translationum* that was supervised from the University of Oxford by Dr O. Murray. Due to my interest in Historiography, I actively took part in the development of **The Institute of Historiography Julio Caro Baroja** in 2001, from which nowadays I am the Head. Moreover, I have published many papers and edited books linked to this line of research. All this research establishes me as a specialist in this area. As a result, I have often been invited to take part in **conferences and congresses** related to historiography. My first **national project** as PI (ALMAHISTO) was related to this second line of research. Due to this funding, we could develop an institutional online repository. The project's staff analysed the process of transformation of historiography in each history area and in other disciplines like literature. Moreover, thanks to ALMAHISTO, we organise several international meetings and an ending congress. As a result, three collective volumes were published, two of them co-edited with two members of the team, and another monograph with Dr A. Duplá published in the Historiography Journal (*RevHisto*).

Once ALMAHISTO project ends, I obtained a subproject of a coordinated project led by University Pablo Olavide. Its main objective was to define narrative paradigms about the Roman Empire under the Antonine Dynasty in the Western historiographical tradition. Due to this research, I published several papers and edited a book. After this project, the MICINN awarded me with RIOMPHEI, which put together 16 researchers from seven different countries, as well as a predoctoral researcher in recognition of our training capacity. This project reinforced a line of research that I had started with my first two projects as PI (funded by Autonomous Community of Madrid) focused on the reception of Pompeii and Herculaneum in Spain. The two books that I have published on these topics as well as other publications have given to me a significant international projection materialised in invited talks in countries like Italy, Germany, Chile, or Colombia. My last project as PI (with Jesús Salas Álvarez) is ANTIMO (2022-2025), which has an international team dedicated to the study of the legacy of Greece and Rome in Latin America.

Regarding my **training capacity and leadership**, I have supervised a doctoral thesis (my pupil is currently working at Isabel I University), and I am supervising two (one of them funded by a predoctoral contract associated with my project). I have disseminated my research by publishing, participating or/and **organizing several congresses** and giving **conferences and seminars** in Spain and abroad. Moreover, all the scientific activities I have organized obtained funding in competitive programmes. Furthermore, I have been part of the **committee of experts** in Humanities and Social Sciences of the Autonomous Community of Madrid and I have evaluated **projects for the AEI**. I have also been a scientific adviser for different **journals and publishers** and belonged to several scientific committees too. Since 2012 I am corresponding **Academician of the Royal Academy of History**. Finally, related to leadership and management of scientific activity, since the creation of **RevHisto**, I have been its secretary, and nowadays I am its Co-Editor-in-chief. Due to its quality and scientific rigour is indexed in SJR (2020), as well as in JCR in Q3. I am also Editor- in- Chief of **Anejos de RevHisto**, in co-edition with Dykinson, publisher ranked 13th according to SPI.

In summary, I have published more than seventy papers, four books as the main author, edited another three, and co-edited seven books. All this research and academic activity were recognised by

six-year terms (four *sexenios*) and several prizes. I was awarded two times by *Virgen del Carmen award for the best Naval History study* in 1995 and 1999, and by UC3M and Banco Santander Excellence Award in 2010.

According to the relevance of disseminating research results outside the academic field, it always be a priority for me. To reach this objective we developed some digital and innovative resources. First, an online repository funded thanks to ALMAHISTO national project. Second, an interactive web map that we have prepared in RIPOMPHEI. Both digital resources are hosted on Uc3m Library web focus on Digital Humanities ([link](#)). Finally, I would like to highlight the documentary about Adrian broadcast on the History Channel, or the exhibition on Hadrian at the Archaeological Museum of Seville.
